HISTORY TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA
CONSTITUTION

1. NAME OF THE ASSOCIATION.
 - 1.1. THE ASSOCIATION shall be called the HISTORY TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA.
2. AIMS AND OBJECTS.
 - 2.1. To stimulate interest and discussion in History and in the Teaching of History.
 - 2.2. To arrange meetings, lectures, seminars and other activities.
 - 2.3. To arrange an annual conference of the Association.
 - 2.4. To issue such publications as will further the aims of the Association.
 - 2.5. To represent the views of the Association to the Public Examinations Board and other bodies.
3. MEMBERSHIP.
 - 3.1. The Association is open to all persons, schools and organisations interested in History and the Teaching of History.
 - 3.2. Schools may be corporate members of the Association. Such school membership shall count only as a single membership, and shall not confer any rights or privileges on an individual, but a school may nominate one individual to vote on its behalf at all meetings of the Association.
4. FINANCE. three dollars
 - 4.1. The membership fee shall be per annum and will entitle a member to receive the Association's publication.
 - 4.2. Students at the University and Teachers' Colleges may become members on paying a fee of one dollar per annum and this will entitle them to receive the Association's publication.
 - 4.3. The account of the Association shall be kept at the Savings Bank of South Australia.
 - 4.4. The Signatories shall be the Treasurer and any one of the President or Secretary.
 - 4.5. The Treasurer shall render a Statement to the Annual General Meeting of the Association.
 - 4.6. An Auditor shall be elected by the Annual General Meeting.
5. OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE.
 - 5.1. The Annual General Meeting shall elect a committee of twelve which shall have power to co-opt when necessary.
 - 5.2. A Quorum of the Committee shall consist of five.
 - 5.3. The Committee shall elect an Executive Committee from among its members.
 - 5.4. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Publications Officer.
 - 5.5. The Committee shall have power to appoint such sub committees as are necessary.
 - 5.6. The Committee shall have full power to conduct the affairs of the Association.
 - 5.7. The Executive Committee shall have power to make decisions in an emergency.
6. THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.
 - 6.1. The Annual General Meeting shall be the first meeting of the year.
7. ALTERATIONS TO THE CONSTITUTION.
 - 7.1. The Constitution may be altered by a simple majority of the Annual General Meeting.
 - 7.2. A month's notice in writing must be given of intention to alter the Constitution.
